- Project funded by the European Innovation Partnership (EIP) initiative
- EIPs are projects administered by Irelands DAFM, funded by Ireland RDP
- Irelands EIPs supported by the National Rural Network (NRN)
- OviData granted €500K funding (over 5 years)

EIP objectives

- Foster collaboration between farmers, scientists, advisors, NGOs etc
- Address specific issues or take advantage of new opportunities
- Road test new ideas to improve productivity, sustainability & efficiency

- Using Genotyping
 - Assign lamb parentage in commercial flocks
 - 6 Teagasc Better farms involved
 - Template for future commercial data capture?



Objectives

- Data collection
 - Unlocking data currently being collected
 - Health phenotypes
 - Focus on carcase data collection
 - Commercial farm test of Sheep Ireland App







OviData Activities (so far)

- DNA (Ear biopsy) from 1500 ewes and rams collected
- DNA from all lambs born (EID NSIS tag incorporating a DNA sampling kit)
- First health data (lameness, dag & mastitis) collected
- Developing standard phenotype collection standards which can be used by all Irish sheep farmers





OviData Activities (to come)

- Capture longevity data on all project flocks
- Collect lamb carcase data for use in genetic evaluations
- Develop commercial farm data reports to enable more informed breeding decisions
- Promote commercial farm data recording to improve farm
